Overview

Through GEDI, USAID and ANDE will foster a <u>stronger entrepreneurial</u> <u>ecosystem</u> to bring economic prosperity to communities heavily impacted by irregular migration from Guatemala.

About **GEDI**

GEDI will develop a coordinated set of expanded business support services available to entrepreneurs, particularly to businesses run by, employing, or serving the needs of women, indigenous and rural communities, and youth.

Proposals outcomes

- Access to new and/or better markets
- Access to capital
- Access to business support services for investment readiness
- Increase economic development opportunities





Overview of GEDI Fund

ANDE Funds

History: Catalyst and Challenge Funds have run since 2009

Target: SGB sector – To support service providers

Goals:

ANDE strategic priorities contribute to SDGs 5-Gender Equality, 8-Decent Work and Economic Growth & 13-Climate and Environmental Action.

Aim:

GEDI seeks to foster a stronger entrepreneurial ecosystem to bring economic prosperity to regions and communities heavily affected by migration.

GEDI Fund

Funding support: USAID and private sector partners

Target regions: Republic of Guatemala

Eligible organization type:

Non-profit and for-profit entrepreneur support organizations. ANDE members and non-members.

Project size: USD 200,000 -

USD 300,000

Funding Type: Grants (non profits) and contracts (for-profits)

Model: Cost-reimbursable model

Timeline

Concept note issuance: December 9, 2022

Deadline for concept notes: January 30, 2023

Shortlisted applicants invited to submit full proposal: March 1, 2023

Deadline for shortlist to submit full proposal: March 31, 2023

Awards announced: May 2023

Implementation: 12 months (July 2023 - June 2024)





Eligible organizations

Organizations eligible to apply

 Non-profit and for-profit entrepreneur support organizations, such as: Incubators, accelerators, investors, capacity development providers, non-governmental organizations, operating (non-grantmaking) foundations, and advisory service providers, are qualified to apply.

Ineligible organizations

- Government agencies, donor finance institutions and grantmaking foundations are not eligible to apply.
- Current GEDI subgrantees (Cohort 1) are not eligible to apply as project leads nor as project subcontractors.





Concept note submission formats and content

Concept Notes should include:

- Cover page
- Organizational overview/information
- Narrative description of the proposed intervention
- Funding table, including a high-level line-item breakout

Text-Based Document:

- Page Limit: Five pages (one for cover page, three for narrative, one for budget)
- Format: Submit in PDF. Templates can be found <u>here</u>.
- English or Spanish





Proposals should fall in at least one or more of the following thematic tracks (multiple tracks are accepted but not necessary):

1. <u>Agriculture:</u>

- 1.1. Initiatives from ESOs that support rural agricultural SGBs and consider one of the following aspects in their support to entrepreneurs:
 - Agroindustrial products: transformation of local products
 - Sustainable production (forest-free, environmentally friendly, climate-resilient agricultural solutions)
 - Innovations in the value chain
- 1.2. Initiatives from ESOs that support SGBs, and offer services related to agriculture
 - Logistics
 - Innovative agricultural products
 - Incorporation of technology in agro-industrial processes (irrigation, climate-smart technology, agtech)
 - E-commerce (digitize processes, etc.)
- 1.3. Initiatives from ESOs that support SGBs related to Guatemala's forest production chains (i.e. non-timber forest products)
 - Promote the conservation and/or regeneration of biodiversity
 - Ecotourism, community tourism
 - Food systems





Thematic Tracks

Proposals should fall in at least one or more of the following thematic tracks (multiple tracks are accepted but not necessary):

- 1. <u>Clean Energy</u>: Initiatives from ESOs that support SGBs focused on providing products or services related to climate change mitigation and natural disaster prevention
 - Technology-based solutions to mitigate climate change
 - Nature-based solutions to mitigate climate change
- 2. <u>WASH:</u> Initiatives from ESOs that support SGBs whose business models address the water and sanitation issue with innovative approaches like circular economy

3. Organizational and Ecosystem Strengthening:

- Proposals from funds that are driving investment to the region
- Funding to strengthen specific organizational areas within promising ESOs to make them even more effective at supporting SGBs

Selection process

- Step 1: Pre-screening ANDE internal project team screens concept notes to ensure submissions meet basic qualifying criteria
- Step 2: Using a scoring matrix, review committee identifies the top applicants that are invited to submit full proposals
- Step 3: An external selection committee (third-party experts, ANDE partners and funders) reviews proposals to make final decisions
- Winners announced May 2023





Criteria for winning proposals

- Follow submission guidelines and qualifying criteria
 - Demographic and geographic scope
 - Thematic tracks
 - Budget parameters (unallowable: equipment costs, seed capital)
- Compelling partnerships and value for money (Consortium: complementary and clear roles from each organization)
- Local organizations are strongly encouraged to apply
- Proposals that leverage private sector partnership and/or investment are highly encouraged
